



Poso Creek IRWM Plan Implementation Activity and Correspondence for December 2018 and January 2019

ADMINISTRATION

- North Kern WSD submitted the request for a budget amendment and time extension for the Poso Creek IRWM Plan Update agreement with DWR. The request was granted by the DWR.

PLAN UPDATE

- Several of the Chapters are in final draft. Water quality information was incorporated into the section to define regional water quality conditions. Some chapters were distributed to the RWMG for review. Additional chapters will be sent out as they are compiled into a draft document.

OUTREACH/DAC's

- A preliminary list of DAC projects continues to be compiled in coordination with the Division of Drinking Water, Kern County and David Warner of Self-Help Enterprises. GEI met in late January with Self-Help Enterprises to confirm status and inclusion of the smaller communities within Poso Creek IRWM. The TKFA DACIP group is also developing a web-based needs assessment tool that will be available in early 2019. Through this program, there is outreach and DAC engagement funding provided to Self-Help who is conducting surveys and assisting the Region with identifying communities who are willing to actively participate in the IRWM program. New projects are expected to be identified through these efforts, particularly since Self-Help and CWC has expressed interest in expanding their program efforts into private wells and state-small water systems (a private well that supplies less than 5 homes and is regulated by the County).
- Tulare-Kern DAC Involvement Program – Project Advisory Committee (PAC)
 - PAC Meetings are held bi-monthly. Currently the PAC is focused on directing the needs assessment tools that Provost & Pritchard is developing, and the Outreach and Engagement work that Self-Help is conducting. Frank O., Stephanie H. and Christine Gutierrez are actively participating in the meetings on behalf of the Poso Creek IRWM/DACs. Vanessa Yap was replaced with Christine Gutierrez, a new staff professional who started at GEI on November 26. The PAC participants will start voting on project proposals on March 28, 2019. Each of the 7 IRWM's actively participating in the DACIP are expected to receive funding to implement a project in their Region.
