Mr. Gianquinto noted that the majority of this month's work was tied to preparing for the presentation to the State Board on Methodology for Setting a Sustainable Management Criteria for Groundwater Levels. The presentation was agreed upon by the subbasin and was presented to the State Board on October 4<sup>th</sup> and received good feedback.

Mr. Gianquinto also provided an update on the Lost Hills Utility District (LHUD) Groundwater Extraction Budget and Settlement Agreement, noting that the agreement was fully executed.

### **INFORMATIONAL AND UP-DATE ITEMS**

Manager Gianquinto noted that the Staff Report, titled "District Activity During September 2023," dated October 6, 2023, was included with the Board Packet. In addition, the following items were discussed:

The State Water Contractors are continuing to engage with DWR to respond to public comments on the draft EIR for the proposed Delta Conveyance Project (DCP), refine operations criteria and modeling, and to advance the DCP Contract Amendment. DWR is expecting to complete the Final EIR for DCP by the end of 2023. The Final EIR will include responses to comments and edits to the Draft EIR as necessary to respond to comments.

As previously noted, on April 20, 2023, the SWP Allocation was increased from 75 to 100%.

The District for the month of August continues to maximize deliveries of SWP water to the District, KWB and Pioneer.

On October 3rd, the SWCs provided an operations update. The Allocation models continue to support the 100% allocation. DWR noted that the anticipated end of year storage will be lower than projected. Accordingly, it is not expected that SWP Article 21 water will be made available this fall as noted in previous reports. Also, this

also leads one to believe that the risk of losing carryover is reduced.

Ms. Isela Medina, District Engineer, provided an update on recurring activities and winter work.

Mr. John Lynch, District Superintendent, provided an update regarding O&M activities.

At 1:54 p.m. President Waterhouse adjourned the Regular Board meeting, and it was reported that there was a need for the Board to reconvene in closed session.
