For Buttonwillow Improvement District, the General Administrative Service

Charge is \$1.50 per acre and the General Project Service Charge is \$137.90 per acre. The Special Minimum General Project Service Charge for recreational land and irrigated native pasture is \$10.90 per acre, and made no change to the New Lands Surcharge

For Pond-Poso Improvement District, the General Administrative Service Charge is \$1.50 per acre and the General Project Service Charge is \$137.90 per acre. The Special Minimum General Project Service Charge for recreational land and irrigated native pasture is \$10.90 per acre, and made no change to the New Lands Surcharge

SWRU - Construction Update by W.M. Lyles

INFORMATIONAL AND UP-DATE ITEMS

Manager Gianquinto noted that the Staff Report, titled "District Activity During April 2023", dated May 10, 2023, was included with the Board Package. In addition, the following items were discussed:

On April 20, 2023 the SWP Allocation was increased from 75 to 100%. The SWP has not provided a 100% allocation since 2006. On April 28th the SWC's Operation's committee held a meeting at which DWR presented an updated suite of allocation studies based upon the most recent hydrology. The 100% allocation is consistent with DWR's Allocation analysis for the 90% probability of exceedance.

As previously noted, DWR initiated deliveries of Article 21 on March 22nd. The District, for the month of April continued taking delivery of Article 21 in District as well as delivering Article 21 to the Kern Water Bank . The District's ability to take Article 21 at the Kern Water Bank and in District is limited due to preference for maximizing delivery of Kern River Lower River Water via the KCWA which started on March 17th. The District is currently blocked from recharging water at the Pioneer Project as the recharge participants are banking for overdraft correction.

District staff are working diligently to maximize opportunities for recharge for the benefit of the District and our Banking partners. District staff continues to engage with landowners to promote landowner recharge as well as to maximize delivery of Non-Contract water for in-lieu recharge. The District, based upon our historical operations for the months of May to December expects to deliver between 330,000 and 400,000 AF. This includes a minimum of 140,050 for our bankers and delivery of our 100% table A (155,000 AF) by December 31, 2023. Lastly, the District continues working with our neighboring districts (Buena Vista, North Kern, Shafter Wasco) to maximize the utility of our existing interties.
